Frequently Asked Questions

1. How do the students exercise their option?

Students will log into the All-Ears form QR code / link given to exercise their options. Those who have issues logging in can contact their form teachers for assistance.

2. What are some things for parents/guardians to bear in mind when we discuss the subject combination options with our child/ward?

It is useful to keep the following good practices in mind:

- Communicate openly with your child/ward about his/her interests, passions, career aspirations and strengths
- Listen with an open mind when your child/ward shares his/her interests, career aspirations and views
- Gather information on possible future pathways
- Encourage your child/ward to maintain a growth mindset and strive to improve in areas that he/she may not be strong in yet.

3. Will students be offered their 1st choice?

In allocation of subject combination, the school considers both student needs and school resources. Allocation of subject combination is based on:

- Merit (Overall percentages at Secondary 2 and subject eligibility criteria)
- Rank order (student's 1st choice will be considered if his/her results meet the subject criteria)
- Subject teacher's recommendation (in terms of attitude and aptitude)
- Take up rate for the subject and combination

4. Can I appeal if my child/ward does not get his/her choice of subject combination?

When the results are released, students are to check their subject combination allocated. In the event that they wish to appeal to a different elective or subject, they must ensure that they had met the cut-off point for that particular option (E.g., Sec 2 D&T results for D&T option).

If students meet the above criteria, the school will likely accept the appeal and change the subject combination subsequently. If they had not met the criteria, the team would then consult with the relevant HOD and subject teacher if we can accept the student who had not met the criteria. On a case-by-case basis with teacher's recommendations, we may or may not approve the appeal as subjects in upper secondary will be more demanding than lower secondary.

All students are strongly encouraged to consider and exercise their options carefully. The school would only consider appeals under exceptional circumstances, and the success of the appeal process depends on merit, academic performance, vacancy, demand, and school's resources.

5. Is there a minimum or maximum quota of students for each subject combination?

For every subject, the minimum number to start a class is 10 students.

For Pure Science subject combination, the maximum quota is 40 students.
