A. Term 2 Calendar of Events

Some highlights include:

Artist-In-School Scheme:

In partnership with the National Arts Council, selected Secondary 2 and 3 students will participate in programmes to deepen their interest and skills in visual and literary arts. Under the tutelage of professional artist, Ms Celine Chia, Secondary 2 participants learn to create digital art representations of their literary works, which will be added as enhancements to the school's augmented reality literary arts trail. As part of the Secondary Three Art curriculum, students learn street style digital illustration and design from Mr Zulkarnaen Othman (ZERO). Through these programmes, students can gain valuable insights into the workings of the arts industry and develop their artistic skills for creative pursuits in art and design in the future.

IgnITE Skills Challenge:

Selected students will be participating in this hands-on competition, organised by ITE. Students attend a workshop to gain valuable skills before they embark on the Challenge. Held from 27 March to 16 April 2025, it provides students with valuable exposure to various vocational skills challenges at ITE as well as prepares them for the upcoming Early Admission Exercise.

- Mother Tongue Languages Fortnight: This two-week programme will be held from 2 April to 11 April 2025. It aims to strengthen students' cultural understanding and enhance their Mother Tongue Language competency through structured activities and workshops. Each level will engage in distinct thematic activities, ranging from traditional culinary arts to heritage games, aligned with their learning objectives.
- B. <u>Student-Initiated Learning (SIL) Projects on Home-Based Learning (HBL) Days</u> Our students have been exploring areas of interest as part of their student-initiated learning (SIL) projects and documenting their journey in their class Padlet. We encourage parents to check in with their children about their projects — ask about their progress, challenges, and discoveries. Engaging in these conversations strengthens your connection and supports their learning. You can also explore the class Padlet together to celebrate their journey.
- C. <u>Personal Learning Device (PLD) Rollout for Secondary 1 students</u> Our Secondary 1 students will receive their Personal Learning Devices (PLD) on Friday, 4 April. Students will report to their classrooms at 2.30 p.m. to undergo the onboarding process with staff and vendors.

Parents will choose the desired setting for their child's/ward's PLD via the Device Management Application (DMA). The DMA supports students as they learn to use their PLD safely and responsibly. More information will be sent to parents nearer the date.

D. School Rules and Regulations: Recess and Lunch Break


