B. Typical Week

Our school timetable follows a 2-week cycle (odd and even weeks), with lessons structured into 30-minute periods.

C. <u>Blended Learning and Home-Based Learning (HBL) Days</u>

Blended Learning aims to provide students with a seamless combination of different modes of learning. Through this, we also hope to develop our students into self-directed, independent learners, who are passionate and motivated in working on their strengths and interests. A main aspect of Blended Learning is the integration of Home-Based Learning (HBL) as a regular feature of the schooling experience.

HBL is loosely structured for students to be self-directed in learning with dedicated time and space for students to learn at their own pace, explore their interests and learn outside the curriculum via their student-initiated learning (SIL) projects. This can take place through a variety of learning modes, with or without the use of their personal learning devices (PLD).

Home-based learning (HBL) will be conducted across all levels on **most even week Fridays**, in Semester 1, with the exception of 13 March and 29 May. Students do not report to school on HBL days. Please refer to the HBL days for 2026.

D. Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs)

Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs) play a vital role in our students' holistic education. Through CCA participation, students not only discover their interests and talents but also develop character, learn important values, and build social-emotional skills that prepare them for future challenges. CCAs bring together students from diverse backgrounds, fostering friendships and a strong sense of belonging within our school and wider community. Participation in CCA is **compulsory** for all secondary students.

To share with our Secondary 1 students about the various CCAs available, we will be hosting a CCA Carnival on Thursday, 8 January, from 3.00 p.m. to 5.30 p.m. At the carnival, our Secondary 2-5 students will have the opportunity to share more about their CCA directly with their juniors.

E. School Rules and Regulations: Mobile Phones

The school takes a firm stance against the use of mobile phones during school hours, including recess/lunch and CCAs. Students are required to place their mobile phones in their lockers at the start of the day. Phones may only be retrieved at the end of the school day. To ensure security, students may use their own lock to secure their lockers.

We kindly seek your support in reinforcing this rule with your child/ward, emphasising that mobile phone use during school hours is strictly prohibited.

Please be aware that any student found using or displaying a mobile phone during school hours will have their device confiscated and will be required to serve detention. Phones will be returned only after the student has completed their detention.

Thank you for your cooperation in helping us maintain a focused and productive learning environment.

F. School Rules and Regulations: Conduct Grade

Students' conduct grades may be impacted by, but are not limited to, irregular attendance at school and/or CCAs, frequent late arrivals, and any offences committed. We appreciate your partnership in helping to instill and uphold our school values of *Integrity, Respect, Responsibility, Resilience, and Compassion* in every student.

G. <u>Health and Safety-Related Matters</u>

We seek your support in maintaining a safe and healthy school environment. If your child/ward is unwell, please ensure they stay home and seek medical care if needed. We would also like to remind everyone of the importance of prompt submission of medical certificates (MC)/letters via Parents Gateway. Please note that students are required to serve the full duration of their MC before returning to school. Should they wish to return earlier, a medical note indicating clearance from a doctor will be required.

ROAD SAFETY OF STUDENTS

We would like to seek your cooperation in ensuring the safety of students travelling to and from school. As our students are still developing their road sense and spatial awareness, and may be less visible due to their height, your partnership is crucial in creating a safe school environment. The following provide parents of our school's road safety policies and guidelines.

Safe Driving Guidelines

When driving in the school vicinity, please

- Observe speed limits and remain vigilant for pedestrians within the school zone
- Follow all traffic rules and avoid reckless driving or illegal manoeuvres, e.g. turning into the school from the outer lane(s)
- Follow directions from traffic marshals to facilitate safe and smooth traffic flow
- Avoid the unnecessary honking
- Use designated student pick-up and drop-off points during school arrival and dismissal
- Where allowed, ensure swift and safe alighting of your child on the kerb side with the help of an adult

Student Safety Guidelines

Please remind your child to:

- Use designated pedestrian crossings and avoid jaywalking or crossing recklessly
- Refrain from running to catch buses, and avoid crossing in front of or behind stationary buses
- Do not play near or on the road
- Stay alert while crossing roads and keep mobile phones away
- Practise the 'Kerb Drill' before crossing:
 - Look right, look left, look right again
 - Ensure all vehicles have stopped
 - Raise hand to indicate crossing intention




